Dear Friends,

'Heart' and 'dedication' well describe 2010 at Methodist Health Foundation. In our economy still recovering, the Foundation witnessed many demonstrations of both, and realized marked success in the ongoing fulfillment of its mission as the charitable support organization for Methodist Hospital.

Thanks to your generosity, several major estate gifts and improved markets, the Foundation's assets approached \$129,000,000, which is an all-time high.

One shining demonstration of heart and dedication, not surprisingly, came from hospital employees. The Employee Campaign had a goal of \$1,000,000. Thanks to the dedication of the employees, leaders, Campaign Cabinet and Luminaire ambassadors, along with the inspired direction of Campaign Chair, Jane Manning, over \$2,000,000 were raised – double the goal! And their success helped inspire the Physician Campaign, led by Art Coffey, MD.

The need for a new critical care bed tower at Methodist, as well as physician and nursing education fellowships, has prompted the Foundation's capital campaign. Indiana University Health's leadership confirmed that there is no higher priority within the system than construction of the new tower.

Methodist Hospital Society and the 20th anniversary of Hughes Campbell Society were celebrated last October. Since 1990 more than 200 generous friends of Methodist have made provisions in their estate plans to benefit the hospital. The society is named after the late Francis Hughes and Eldon Campbell, who were inspired leaders within the hospital and the Foundation, and together left a legacy of high philanthropic stewardship.

The hospital reached the following new levels of distinction in 2010, further demonstrating its dedication to serving the critical care needs of Indiana:

- Re-verification as an adult **Level I Trauma Center** – one of only two in the state – by the American College of Surgeons Committee on Trauma. This achievement recognizes Methodist's preeminence in providing optimal care for injured patients.
- Honored recognition with the Quality Leadership Award as one of the nation's **Top 5 Academic Medical Centers** for the fourth year. Presented by University HealthSystem Consortium, this prestigious distinction recognizes excellence in the quality of patient care.
- *U.S. News and World Report's* ranking of Methodist, Clarian and IU School of Medicine programs among the top fifty hospitals in the nation for the thirteenth consecutive year.

As always, the focal points of Methodist Health Foundation are its service to the hospital and its relationship with you – the generous donors, family and friends of the hospital and Foundation. We give you mighty thanks for your support that allows us to fulfill that mission.

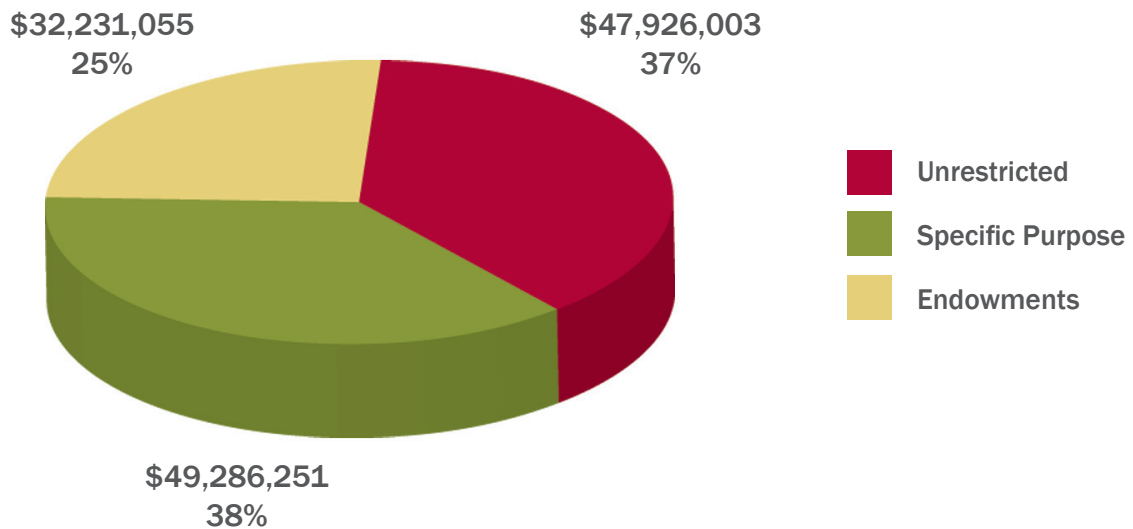
